SUC Accomplishments Revisited

108 Members of AACCUP
107 With Accreditation
22 Top Performing SUCs. All 22 have more than 1/2 of their
programs accredited
70% of SUCs have more than 1/2 of their programs are already
accredited

SUC Accomplishments

- 1,412 Programs Accredited in 2016
- 4,177 Programs Accredited (1992-2016)
- 5 Granted Institutional Accreditation
- 35 Level IV programs (0.57%)



Accreditations

- 4,211 Trained Accreditors
- 3,073 Trained under OBQA
- 1,280 Actually participated in 2016



AACCUP Biggest Challenge

How to accommodate an increasing number of applications for accreditation visits.



The Risk

- 1. Only 42 % of SUCs are carrying the ball for accreditation
- 2. Sustained training of accreditors necessary
- 3. Some trained Accreditors have performed very poorly



In spite of challenges "SUCs performance is still outstanding in 30 years



Agenda in the next 10 years

- Strengthen ability of Internal quality assurance
- Gradual devolution of program accreditation
- The goal: SUCs assume responsibility of accrediting their programs.



The Strategy

- 1. Internal QA Offices
 - -Formally organised, staff, supported
- 2. Gradual delegation of authority to conduct accreditation to qualified SUCs
 - Preliminary Surveys in 2016
 - Level I and II in 2017
 - Level III in 2019
 - Level IV in 2020



- 3. Legitimation of devolved authority
- 4. Target: At least 80% of SUCs empower to accredit their program by 2026.

Quo Vadis AACCUP

- 1. Continue training of Internal Accreditors
- 2. Conduct Institutional Accreditation
- 3. The twin internationalization program will bring AACCUP influence in foreign countries
